<u>Assata's Daughters</u>	Assata's Daughters ("AD") is a Black woman-led, young person-directed organization rooted in the Black Radical Tradition. AD organizes young Black people in Chicago by providing them with political education, leadership development, mentorship, and revolutionary services. Through our programs we aim to Deepen, Escalate, and Sustain the Movement for Black Liberation.
<u>About Face</u>	About-Face arms girls with the knowledge and tools they need to fight back against a culture that diminishes and disempowers them. Our programs for teen girls range from our Education Into Action in-school programs to a weekend boot camp, and our online resources for teens here on the site. We also support their adult advocates – parents, teachers, mentors, relatives, and group leaders – through adult-centered workshops as well as curriculum development and support.
<u>Alliance for Girls</u>	Alliance for Girls mobilizes girls' champions to address barriers facing girls, create conditions for their success, and advance systemic change to achieve equity. We are the largest regional alliance of girl-serving organizations and leaders in the country. Our membership includes 100+ organizations that employ 2,400 people with more than 5,100 volunteers serving more than 300,000 girls across six Bay Area counties.
<u>Athena Camps</u>	Athena Camps' mission is to inspire courage and build confidence in girls through a unique combination of athletic, creative, emotional, and social activities in a nurturing community. We help girls aged four through fourteen develop their whole selves. Athena Campers participate in sports and creative exercises to learn how to give and receive positive affirmation, make new friends, and acquire the strength and grace to be their best in every situation. Athena Camps is not a traditional sports camp. Our goal is to build body-confidence through sports, giving girls a sense of control over their bodies.
<u>BAWSI</u>	A weekly after school program using physical activity as a backdrop for building resiliency in second- through fifth-grade girls at underserved schools.
<u>Black Girls Code</u>	Black Girls CODE is devoted to showing the world that black girls can code, and do so much more. By reaching out to the community through workshops and after school programs, Black Girls CODE introduces computer coding lessons to young girls from underrepresented communities in programming languages such as Scratch or Ruby on Rails.
<u>Black Girls Rock</u>	This New York-based youth empowerment organization offers girls of color weekend art and tech programs, tutoring, and leadership skill-building, in addition to the Black Girls Lead! conference, where 13- to 17-year-olds spend seven days in panel discussions and workshops with role models in fields ranging from entertainment to science.
<u>Brown Girls Do</u>	Brown Girls Do Inc is a registered not-for-profit 501c3 dedicated to promoting diversity in the arts by providing annual scholarships, a mentor network, and community programs to empower young girls. To learn more about our specific programs, click the links below.

<u>Gaia Girls</u>	Gaia Girls* Passages provides long term mentoring for female-identified youth through nature and soul based after-school and summer programs in the San Francisco Bay area.
<u>Girl Effect</u>	Girl Effect is a creative non-profit – experts in media, mobile, brand and international development – working where girls are marginalised and vulnerable. We build youth brands and mobile platforms that millions of girls and boys love and interact with. From apps that build skills, to TV dramas that explore vital issues, to magazines written and distributed by girls.
<u>Girl Scouts</u>	Girl Scouts of the USA (GSUSA) is the largest organization for girls in the world with a mission to build girls of courage, confidence and character, who make the world a better place. Girl Scouts provides a 21st century experience for girls designed to help them learn to be leaders in today's world.
<u>Girl Up</u>	Through leadership development training, Girl Up gives girls the resources and platform to start a movement for social change wherever they are. <u>Girls for a Change</u>	Girls For A Change (GFAC) is a nonprofit youth development organization aimed at empowering Black girls and other girls of color in Central Virginia to visualize their bright futures and potential through discovery, development, innovation and social change in their communities.
<u>Girls Garage</u>	Girls Garage is a nonprofit design and building program and dedicated workspace for girls ages 9-17. Through classes in carpentry, welding, architecture, and activist art, we support and equip a community of fearless girls who are building the world they want to see.
<u>Girls Going Global</u>	Girls Going Global gives 13- to 17-year-old girls of color in the Atlanta and Philadelphia areas the opportunity to explore at home and abroad through service learning projects, local field trips, and international travel camps to destinations like Costa Rica and Peru
<u>Girls Inc</u>	Girls Inc. inspires all girls to be strong, smart, and bold through direct service and advocacy. The organization's research-based programming, delivered by 81 local affiliates in the United States and Canada, gives girls the knowledge, skills and confidence they need to be healthy, educated, and independent.
<u>Girls Leadership</u>	We equip girls with the skills to exercise the power of their voice.: 1) Girls Leadership works not only with girls, but also with their primary influencers – parents, teachers, and caregivers – to create sustainable impact. Studies show parents and teachers to be the most powerful teachers for girls all the way through high school. 2) We put social and emotional learning (SEL) at the foundation of all our leadership development. 3) We see girls' real-life, every-day relationships with friends and family as the primary opportunity we have to teach girls the leadership skills that will serve them over a life-time: self-advocacy, negotiation, compromise, personal responsibility and conflict as an opportunity for change.
<u>Girls Leading Girls</u>	Girls Leading Girls is a San Francisco-based nonprofit organization that trains young women in leadership and life skills through soccer. Our programs run year round, locally and internationally. We strive to build communities and develop strong female leaders.

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<u>Girls on the Run</u>	We inspire girls to be joyful, healthy and confident using a fun, experience-based curriculum which creatively integrates running.
<u>Girls Opportunity Alliance</u>	The Girls Opportunity Alliance, a program of the Obama Foundation, seeks to empower adolescent girls around the world through education, allowing them to achieve their full potential and transform their families, communities, and countries. We engage people around the world to take action to help adolescent girls and the grassroots leaders working to educate them.
<u>Girls Rock Camp Alliance</u>	The Girls Rock Camp Alliance is an international membership network of youth-centered arts and social justice organizations. We provide resources and space for community building to our membership in order to build a strong movement for collective liberation.
<u>Girl Talk</u>	We inspire middle and high school girls to be confident leaders through peer-to-peer mentoring. High school girls gain practical experience using leadership skills to plan and run weekly meetings for middle school girls. As they build a supportive network, middle school girls learn valuable skills in a safe environment with peers who understand the difficulties and challenges they face.
<u>Girls to Women</u>	Girls to Women partners with Mid-Peninsula families, other local youth development agencies, and local schools to provide year-round programming which supports the healthy development of 75 low-income girls and young women ages 6 to 25. At the core of our youth development approach is respect for the abilities, knowledge and potential of each girl we serve.
<u>Girls Who Code</u>	Girls Who Code is on a mission to close the gender gap in technology and to change the image of what a programmer looks like and does. We're building the largest pipeline of future female engineers in the United States.
<u>Girls Write Now</u>	Girls Write Now mentors underserved young women to find their voices through the power of writing and community.
<u>GirlStart</u>	Girlstart's mission is to increase girls' interest and engagement in STEM through innovative, nationally-recognized informal STEM education programs.
<u>GirlVentures</u>	GirlVentures inspires girls to lead through outdoor adventure, inner discovery, and collective action. The only nonprofit of its kind, GirlVentures combines outdoor adventure with social emotional learning for adolescent girls, at a critical time in their lives. <u>Latinitas</u>	We are a non-profit 501c(3) organization focused on empowering girls to innovate through media and technology. We offer a variety of opportunities for girls to discover their voice, develop media and technology skills and build a solid foundation for their future.
<u>MAGIC (More Active Girls in Computing)</u>	Focus on providing middle and high school girls, who are seriously considering studying a STEM area, with a knowledge of tools and resources available for them to be successful. MAGIC provides one-on-one mentoring in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) for middle and high school girls. It is run by women with careers in technology, and mentoring is carried out on both technical and personal subjects, including work/life balance, the role of girls in our society and how that is changing, how to avoid the technology stereotype, etc.
